Principal's Comments




Student Results

Analyzing data is an essential piece of the Guidance Curriculum. We use this data to implement interventions for student achievement and success. One example of our use of data came upon reviewing **1st quarter grades**: The failure rate for the senior class was notably higher.




Based on this data, a lesson plan was initiated with the senior class regarding managing multiple priorities and developing strategies for energizing and motivating themselves. Pre and post tests were included in the curriculum to ensure that the lesson was effective. Our goal was to decrease senior class failure rate to under 20%.

Quarter 2 grades showed the following improvements:



Our results indicate a 17% drop in the senior class failure rate, proving the counselors' interventions a success.


Student **attendance** at Bristol-Plymouth is seen as essential to gaining the knowledge and success needed for grade promotion and graduation. The counseling staff at Bristol-Plymouth works feverishly to ensure that every student is present for the education that he/she deserves. Group prevention, individual meetings, letters and phone calls are just a few of the ways that the counselors work with the student body to prevent attendance violations. At the close of Term 1, further intervention is provided to those students who may be in danger of violating the attendance policy.




Every student at Bristol-Plymouth meets the state mandated 95% attendance rate for promotion and graduation. This is in part due to counselor intervention and the Directed Studies Saturday School program for those students requiring make-up days.

Focus for Improvement

In light of the implementation of the Massachusetts Department of Education Guidance Curriculum, the Bristol-Plymouth school counselors collected data to illustrate how we currently make use of our time.




Approximately 39% of our time is spent on personal/social issues and crisis intervention. Because of the nature of these issues, the number of students that take up that time is small in comparison to the number of students seen for academic/technical support. Our focus for improvement in the guidance department is to more closely align how our time is spent with state recommendations. Increasing the time spent on guidance curriculum would provide the best opportunity to meet the needs of our whole student population. In an effort to meet this goal, the counseling department will make more outside referrals for school based counseling, implement further group curriculum and make use of the new career center.



Major Achievements

Freshman Shop Placement: All Freshman are able to explore their 1st & 2nd shop choices. For the 2008/2009 school year 80% of students were permanently placed in their first choice shop!


